



Tulloch Homes Modern Slavery statement for financial year 2016/17

Tulloch Homes are committed to improving our practices to ensure modern slavery or human trafficking is not taking place within our business or supply chain. This statement is made pursuant to s.54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and establishes the steps and understanding being taken by Tulloch Homes for financial year ending 31 July 2017.

Modern slavery is a crime and can incorporate slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labour. Tulloch Homes are committed to improving our practices ethically and with transparency, enforcing systems, controls, and training to ensure there are no modern slavery practices occurring within the business or our supply chains.

Tulloch Homes Organisational Structure

We are a leading House Builder based and operating in the Highlands of Scotland, along with sites in Stirling, Aberdeen and the Central Belt of Scotland. We employ approximately 160 staff and 300 sub contractors.

Our third party supply chain includes a preferred list containing construction, professional services, office supplies, domestic/cleaning and IT systems/support. We have undertaken an assessment of risks and requested supplier compliance with the Modern Slavery Act and will carry out reviews to audit and monitor. Tulloch Homes meets all national minimum wage and national living wage criteria and we require our suppliers to meet this law.

Policy

We have undertaken a review of our procurement procedure to ensure that we have identified modern slavery risks and prevention of modern slavery along with other relevant policies which include the recruitment policy and all other HR policies which reflect UK law.

Training

Tulloch Homes are committed to training all management and related departments to ensure that the modern slavery act is understood and effective in ensuring that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in its business or supply chains. KPI's to ensure effectiveness will be continued training to the procurement department and ensuring supply chains are reviewed and complying with the Act.
